Iran like many other developing countries is in the process of pilot for the PRTR, considering long and wide toxicological activities both by Iranian ministries particularly Ministry of Health and department of environment and also academic activities like that in our society: IRANTOX, etc., according to the section: Strategic Plan to Address Chemicals and Waste : In 2017 there were a total of 77 poison control centres in 23 countries of the Asia Pacific region, with the Islamic Republic of Iran having 41 centres. In this region people living in the remaining 30 countries had no access to a centre.
